Note: Exact multipliers differ by service provider; the values above are representative of the popular Spribe variation. The possibility column shows the chance of striking a mine on the *next* expose, presuming no mine has yet appeared.

Since each tile is drawn without replacement, the likelihood <https://wakelet.com/wake/Ap6BqxMVvU6GuTvUALhEe> of striking a mine gradually increases as safe tiles are eliminated, deciding to squander significantly vital.
