

Vehicle glass looks simple until it fails. A windshield crack that seemed harmless on Monday can spread across the driver's view by Friday. A side window shattered in a parking lot turns an ordinary commute into a security problem. A rear windshield with broken defroster lines or impact damage can make wet-weather driving harder than it needs to be.
