In a crawlspace or slab home, it is more difficult, yet you can still estimate its path from the area of bathrooms, the main cleanout, or the plumbing pile design. As soon as you determine the likely exit factor, go outside and mark that line.

Look for subtle signs in the lawn. A faint rectangle-shaped clinical depression is a gift. So is a spot of lawn that matures in different ways in springtime. A set of riser covers makes the task simple, but if no risers were set up, you might still identify a wide, a little cleared up location where the container was backfilled.

If the building slopes, keep in mind the downhill side of your house. Gravity systems usually adhere to the simplest path, though not constantly the fastest. A pump storage tank or uncommon topography can change the reasoning, so keep an open mind.

Know what you are trying to hit

Most septic tanks are rectangle-shaped and typically determine around 4 by 8 feet, 5 by 10 feet, or someplace because variety depending upon age and capacity.
