

Pebble Creek, Florida has a way of surprising people who only know Tampa's busier corridors. At first glance, it can seem like one of those quiet suburban pockets that exist mainly for sleeping, commuting, and mowing lawns on Saturday morning. Spend real time here, though, and a more layered picture comes into focus.
