A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a small platform commission (rake). **Jackpot** Several gamers contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's worth determines the gamer's "ticket" share. A spinner picks one winner who takes everything. Based on the total value contributed; platform takes a percentage fee.

Functions of Modern CSGO Casinos
