How different locksmith jobs are priced

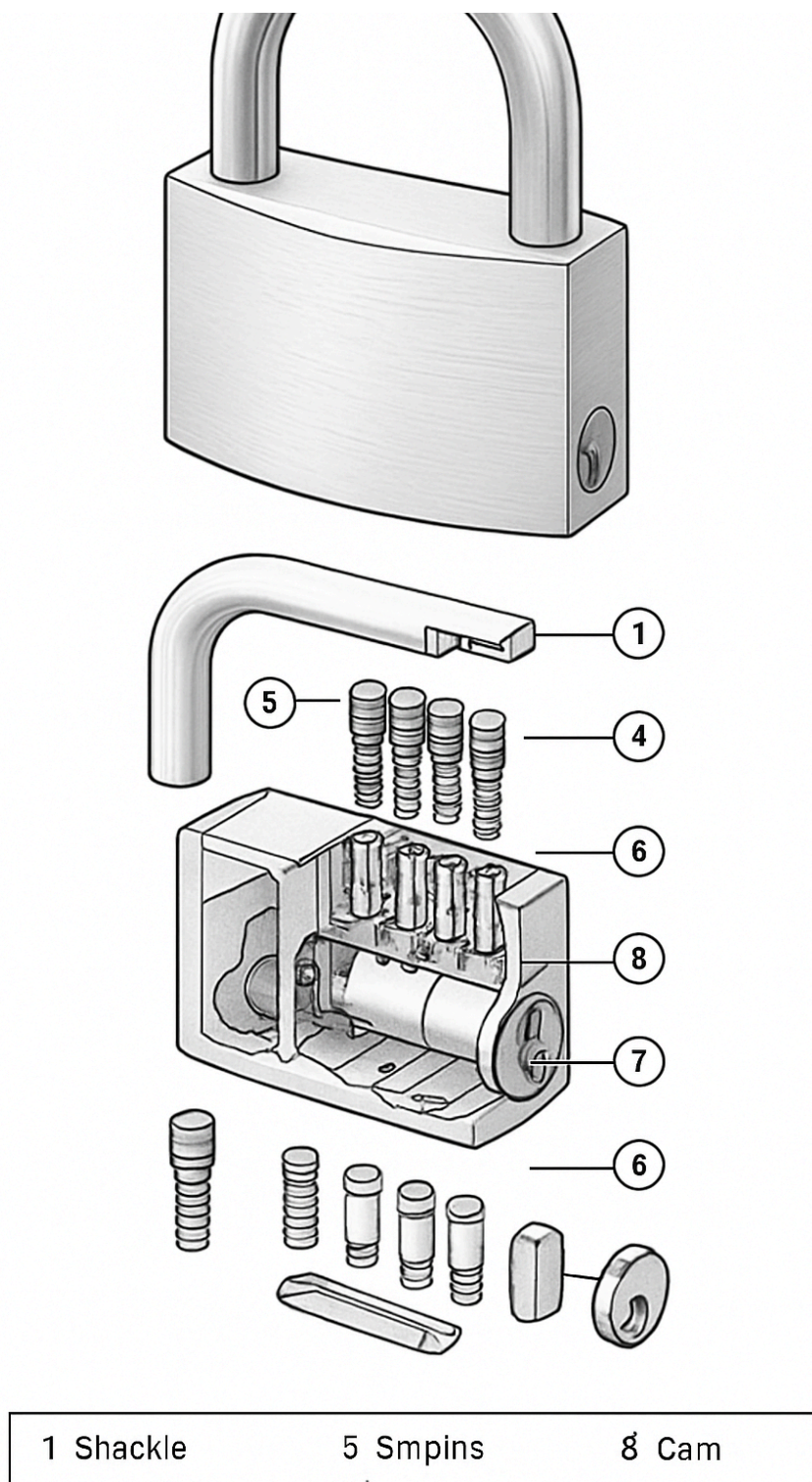
