

If you've just installed **Bingo Plus** on your phone (whether Android or iOS/iPadOS), it's smart to pause and do a quick *app permissions review* and tweak your notification settings. Bingo Plus is a popular mobile game, but like any app, it needs certain permissions to function — and some of those permissions, if unchecked, could impact your privacy or user experience.



In this guide, I'll walk you through exactly what to check in your device settings after installing Bingo Plus. I'm going to explain how Android and iOS handle these controls differently, how to manage notification visibility (including lock screen previews and notification sounds), and why you should never blindly <https://dgmnews.com/bingo-plus-app-and-the-new-standard-for-privacy-aware-mobile-access/> trust links or requests for personal or payment info. Plus, I'll share how to keep your saved passwords safe.

1. Verify You Downloaded Bingo Plus From a Trusted Source

Before we dive into settings, let's confirm you installed Bingo Plus correctly. Here's my persistent advice: **read the full domain name out loud** when downloading any app. This ensures you aren't tricked by lookalike sites or fake app stores.

- **Android users:** Make sure you got Bingo Plus from play.google.com. No other web address, like play-xyz.com or bingo-plus-download.net, should be trusted.
- **iOS/iPadOS users:** Stick to the apps.apple.com domain. Avoid links sent by SMS, emails, or social media that don't clearly come from this domain.

Always double-check that you are not entering sensitive information like credit card numbers or deposits amounts into any app screens or pop-ups that look off or don't provide real promo or price info. Bingo Plus itself does not randomly prompt for prices or deposit specifics without proper context — if you see that, it's a red flag.



2. Review App Permissions on Android vs iOS/iPadOS

App permissions are the gates that control what data and hardware Bingo Plus can access. Here's what you need to know about managing these on both platforms.

2.1 How to Review Bingo Plus Permissions on Android

1. Open **Settings**.
2. Tap **Apps & Notifications** → **See all apps**.
3. Find and tap *Bingo Plus* in the list.
4. Tap **Permissions**.
5. You will see a list of permission categories such as Camera, Location, Storage, Microphone, etc.
6. Ensure you only grant permissions necessary for playing Bingo — usually this means no Camera or Location unless you knowingly use a feature that requires them (e.g., taking a profile picture).
7. If you see permissions like Phone, SMS, or Contacts granted, revoke them unless you have a clear reason.

Tip: Permissions can sometimes activate only while "in use" to save privacy. For example, you can allow location access only when the app is open.

2.2 How to Check Permissions on iOS/iPadOS

1. Open **Settings**.
2. Scroll down and tap *Bingo Plus*.
3. You will see toggles for permissions like Location, Photos, Microphone, Camera, etc.
4. Disable any permissions that don't feel relevant to the game's function.
5. You can also go to **Settings** → **Privacy** → **Privacy Sections** (e.g., Location Services) to see which apps have access.

Remember: iOS prompts you when an app requests access. If you tapped "Allow" without thinking during setup, now's the time to audit and revoke unnecessary permissions.

3. Manage Notification Settings: Control What Bingo Plus Shows & When

Notifications are valuable but can leak private info if previews and sounds aren't managed well.

3.1 Where to Check Notification Settings

Platform Notification Settings Path Android Settings → Apps & Notifications → Bingo Plus → Notifications

iOS/iPadOS Settings → Notifications → Bingo Plus

3.2 What to Look For

- **Lock Screen Previews:** Do you want Bingo Plus notifications to show full message previews on your lock screen? If this includes info about winnings, deposits, or friend chats, consider setting previews to "When Unlocked" or even "Never" to keep strangers from seeing sensitive info.
- **Notification Badges:** These little red dots or numbers on app icons can be helpful but might pressure you into opening the app. Decide if you want these on or off in your device's settings.
- **Sounds and Vibrations:** If you are in meetings, at night, or in public, you might want to mute sounds. You can customize Bingo Plus notification sounds or turn them off altogether.

3.3 How to Customize Lock Screen Visibility

Example for Android:

1. Go to Bingo Plus Notifications.
2. Tap on categories (if listed, like "Messages" or "Promotions").
3. Look for "Lock screen" and choose between "Show all notification content", "Hide sensitive notification content", or "Don't show notifications at all".

Example for iOS/iPadOS:

1. Open *Bingo Plus* notifications.
2. Toggle "Show Previews" setting to "When Unlocked" or "Never".

4. Keep Your Saved Passwords Secure

Many people allow Bingo Plus (or their device's password manager) to save passwords automatically. That's convenient — until someone else gains access to your phone or cloud sync.

Here's a quick permissions audit step I always do after any major app install or OS update:

1. Open your device's **Password Manager** (on Android, usually Google Password Manager integrated with Chrome; on iPhone/iPad, *Settings* → *Passwords*).
2. Find Bingo Plus's saved login info.
3. Make sure that your device requires strong unlock security (PIN, pattern, biometrics) before filling these passwords automatically.
4. Turn off autofill or saved password options for the app if you share your phone or feel uncomfortable.

Tip: Never share your Bingo Plus account credentials via chat with "support" unless it's from a verified, official channel. Phishing attempts often lure players by asking for deposit amounts or promo codes — which Bingo Plus's official support will never ask in unsecured chat.

5. Avoid Common Mistakes: Always Know What You're Approving

Many users install gaming apps and quickly tap "accept" or "allow" without understanding what data or functionality they are granting. Here's what I see too often:

- Providing deposit or payment info in pop-ups that don't list prices or promo details clearly.
- Allowing full Contacts or SMS access without need, which can end up sharing your info with third parties.
- Trusting support requests that ask for one-time codes or personal info right in the app's chat or external links.

My advice? Pause, audit permissions, and if in doubt, contact official support directly through the app's official "Help" section, not random emails or messages.

5 Ignore unverified support requests and never share one-time codes externally
Within app official support section

Final Thoughts

Installing Bingo Plus can bring hours of fun, but like any app that handles accounts or payment info, a little time spent reviewing **app permissions review**, notification settings, and saved password security goes a long way. Always keep your device's controls tight and watch out for questionable requests related to deposits or promo figures.

By following the simple numbered steps here, you'll keep your gaming experience safe, private, and enjoyable. Remember — never trust incomplete links or vague instructions. Be proactive, and your phone will reward you with the best protection.
