- **Why:** Pure entertainment. Mathematically, opening cases is similar to playing a lotto with a heavily manipulated house edge. While striking a rare knife or concealed skin yields a massive dopamine hit (and monetary return), the large majority of openings result in low-tier, low-value weapon surfaces.
