- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look extraordinary even at greater wear values, while others look heavily battered. Understanding how float worths impact cost is vital if you intend to trade or sell your unboxed items.

3. Think About Buying Directly

If there is a specific skin you desperately want, the most affordable path is almost always purchasing it directly off the Steam Market or a trusted third-party market, rather than attempting to bet for it through case openings.
