The Objective of Live Blackjack

The primary goal in live blackjack is simple: **beat the dealership's hand without going beyond an overall of 21.**



Players do not compete against one another; instead, every player at the virtual table plays separately against your house (the dealership). If a gamer's hand is more detailed to 21 than the dealership's hand-- or if the dealer busts (exceeds 21) while the player remains in the game-- the gamer wins.

Card Values and Hand Totals

Bet Type Payment Ratio Description **Basic Win** 1:1 (Even Money) Beating the dealership's total without a blackjack. **Natural Blackjack** 3:2 (or in some cases 6:5) Achieving an Ace and a 10-value card on the preliminary deal. **Insurance coverage Bet** 2:1 Bet put when the dealer's upcard is an Ace, guaranteeing against dealership blackjack.

Pro Tip: Always search for live blackjack tables that pay **3:2 for a natural blackjack** rather than **6:5**, as the 3:2 payment substantially reduces your home edge.

Typical Side Bets in Live Blackjack
