If a gamer receives a skin in a trade, they can not trade it again for a complete week. This badly interrupted the automated, high-frequency trading bots used by CSGO gambling establishments.
- **Account Bans:** Valve consistently bans accounts related to business gambling, resulting in countless dollars worth of skins being locked completely inside prohibited stocks.
