- **Start Small:** Test the waters with low-priced case lobbies (e.g., £ 1 to £ 5 total buy-ins) to comprehend the site's user interface and animation pacing without running the risk of significant funds.
- **Watch Streamers or Community Matches:** Observing experienced players can assist you comprehend how various case mixes act over multiple rounds.
