Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

If gamers are experiencing regular crashes, they should work through the following troubleshooting steps systematically.

1. Confirm the Integrity of Game Files

Gradually, video game files can become corrupted due to stopped working updates, abrupt power outages, or defective storage drives. Steam has a built-in tool to inspect and change missing or broken files.

- Open the **Steam Library**.
- Right-click on **Counter-Strike: Global Offensive** and choose **Properties**.

2. Update Graphics Drivers

3. Change Launch Options

4. Manage Third-Party Overlays and Background Software

- **Discord Overlay:** Disable the in-game overlay in Discord settings.
- **NVIDIA GeForce Experience:** Turn off the in-game overlay.
- **Third-Party Antivirus:** Temporarily whitelist the CS: GO installation folder or run the video game with Windows Defender to guarantee security suites aren't incorrectly flagging video game files as risks.

5. Check for Hardware Overheating and Overclocking

- Download hardware tracking software application like **HWMonitor** or **MSI Afterburner**.

- **Clean out physical dust** from PC fans and heat sinks every 3-- 6 months.

- **Run a disk check (CHKDSK)** regularly to guarantee the storage drive housing CS: GO has no bad sectors.
