

Townhomes across the region often stack three or four levels of living space, which changes how furniture and boxes need to move through the building. **Bulldog Movers in Rockville MD** has developed specific strategies for staircase-heavy layouts common in townhome communities throughout Maryland and Virginia.

Planning the Load Order

DMV Movers typically start by loading items from the top floor first, working downward so the crew is not carrying heavy furniture past already-loaded boxes stacked near the entrance. This sequence keeps stairways clear and reduces the number of trips needed through narrow hallways common in townhome layouts.

Large furniture pieces like sofas and mattresses often need to be angled through stairwells with tight turns. A DMV Moving Company experienced with townhomes measures doorways and stair landings ahead of time to determine whether an item needs to be disassembled or can pass through as is.

Protecting Stairs and Walls During the Move

Corner guards and floor runners protect painted walls and stair edges from scuffing as furniture moves past tight turns. Movers in DMV townhome communities bring this equipment as standard practice, since even a careful crew can nick a wall without protective padding in place.

Managing Parking for Townhome Communities

Townhome neighborhoods often have limited driveway space and shared parking areas, requiring the moving truck to park farther from the front door than in a typical single-family home move. This adds extra walking distance for the crew, which a DMV Moving Company factors into the time **commercial DMV moving company** estimate when quoting a townhome relocation.



- Load from the top floor downward to keep stairways clear
- Measure doorways and stair landings before moving large furniture
- Use corner guards and floor runners to protect walls and stairs
- Account for limited parking near townhome entrances
