2. The Low Multiplier Strategy (Auto-Cashout)

- **How it works:** Players set an automated cashout at a really low multiplier, generally in between 1.01 x and 1.10 x.
- **Risk Level:** Low per round, but vulnerable to unexpected 1.00 x crashes ("instant busts") that erase built up earnings in a single round.

3. The Reverse Martingale (Paroli)

- **How it works:** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, riding hot streaks while keeping losses very little during cold streaks.
- **Threat Level:** Moderate. Needs discipline to leave after a couple of consecutive wins.
