

What does garage door repair usually include?

Garage door repair can involve everything from a minor adjustment to replacing a significant component. A technician may inspect the entire **overhead garage door**, test its balance, check the **garage door track**, secure hardware, lubricate moving parts, and examine the cables, rollers, hinges, and weather seal.

Routine work includes troubleshooting a **garage door opener** that will not run, replacing aged rollers, correcting a damaged track, adjusting poorly aligned sensors, and resolving noisy operation. The technician should also check the remote control, wall button, safety sensors, and automatic reversal feature.

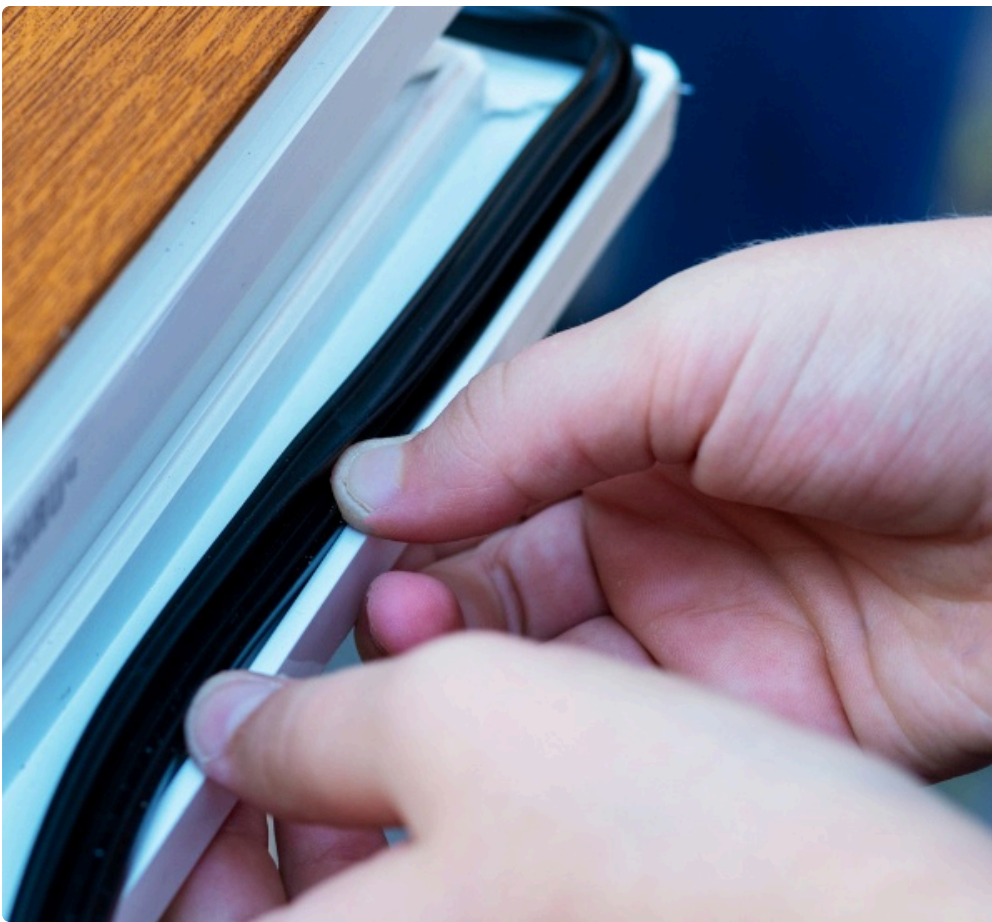
