From there, the process usually includes a controlled wash to remove buildup, attention to organic growth, and spot treatment where oil, rust, or leaf staining has penetrated deeper. After cleaning, the joints may need fresh sand. If the property is being sealed, the surface must dry fully before sealant is applied. That waiting period can be longer than homeowners expect, especially in humid weather or in shaded backyards where the air does not move freely.

A strong result depends on restraint. You want the surface to look renewed, not scrubbed raw. The right **paver cleaning services** should leave the pavers clean enough that you can see the actual color and pattern again, while preserving the integrity of the installation underneath.

Sealing, sand, and the practical side of maintenance

A glossy product can look too shiny for some homes. A poorly matched sealer can darken the surface more than expected or create a blotchy appearance if the substrate is not ready.

Joint sand deserves equal attention. When pavers are cleaned, loose sand often disappears. Replacing it is not a cosmetic extra. Proper sand helps stabilize the system, discourage weeds, and support interlock. On a driveway in particular, that stability matters. Vehicles create lateral movement, and once joints begin to open up, the surface can slowly shift out of line. Re-sanding after cleaning is one of the simplest ways to extend the life of the installation.
