Insulation helps slow heat transfer through the envelope. Air sealing addresses unwanted airflow through gaps, joints, and penetrations. The attic or roofline often receives early attention because of its exposure to solar heat. Walls and other sections of the envelope can matter as well. A property with inconsistent insulation, accessible gaps, or damaged material may have different needs from a new building with open framing.

Comfort concerns do not always identify one specific insulation problem. Uneven room temperatures, drafts, or lengthy HVAC cycles can have several possible causes, including ductwork, equipment, windows, shading, and air leakage. An insulation assessment should therefore look at the property as a system instead of promising that one product will resolve every issue.
