Create a Moving Budget

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Go through your home room by room and identify items you no longer need. Consider donating, selling, recycling, or disposing of unwanted possessions before moving day.

Decluttering can reduce the amount of packing required and may decrease the volume of your shipment.

Find out who your primary contact will be and how you can reach the company if you have questions before or during the move.

Understand Long-Distance Moving Logistics

Pack Your Home Strategically

Begin packing with items you do not use every day. Seasonal clothing, decorations, books, extra kitchenware, and storage belongings are often good places to start.

Use sturdy boxes and appropriate cushioning. Do not overload boxes with heavy items, and use smaller containers for particularly dense belongings.

Keep important documents and valuables separate from general household items.

Label Every Box
