- **Set a Budget**-- Decide beforehand how much you are ready to lose and never ever exceed it.

- **Prevent Chasing Losses**-- Accept that losing streaks occur; do not increase bets to recover.
- **Take Regular Breaks**-- Step far from the game to maintain point of view.
- **Know the Site's Reputation**-- Choose platforms with transparent provably-fair systems and positive user reviews.
