Strategies for CS2 Case Battles

Since CS2 case battles take place specifically on third-party sites instead of the main Steam client, individuals should exercise care.

- **Understand the House Edge:** Just like a casino, the platform hosting the battle takes a cut of every match (either through rake or a little adjusted item evaluation). Over time, your house always wins.
- **Beware of Scams and Phishing:** Never click on random links assuring free balances or skin giveaways. Guarantee you are utilizing legitimate, popular platforms with robust user evaluations.
