Understanding Drop Rates

 Blue (Mil-Spec) 79.92%
 Purple (Restricted) 15.98%

Why these cases dominate:

- **Kilowatt Case**-- Introduced the extremely desired "Howl" in a hidden tier, driving need.
- **Snakebite Case**-- Contains the desired "Fade" and "Cortex" skins, which have strong cosmetic appeal.
- **Operation Bravo Case**-- Historically the very first operation case, with a legendary "Howl" that has actually ended up being a status symbol.

Economic Factors to Consider

- **RNG vs. Investment**-- The anticipated worth (EV) of opening a case is negative; the total market price of all possible skins in a case is usually less than the combined expense of the case plus the secret. For instance, the average expense to open a Weapon Case is approximately £ 3.20 (£ 1.00 case + £ 2.20 key), while the average return hovers around £ 2.00, making the activity a net loss for the bulk of players.
