4. Prize

In a Jackpot video game, multiple gamers toss skins into a main pot. Each skin adds to the gamer's overall percentage chance of winning the entire pot (based upon the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner chooses a winning ticket, and one lucky player takes home all the deposited skins.
