Numbers flatten horror, yet in addition they withstand amnesia. Around fifty one,000 adult males had been killed, wounded, captured, or lacking over 3 days in July 1863. Under the summer sunlight, soldiers bled into the rocky soil of Little Round Top, the Peach Orchard, the Wheatfield, the perimeters of Culp's Hill, and throughout the vast undeniable that swallowed Pickett's Charge. It was victory, however the style that leaves a kingdom bowled over and gray-faced. The males who fought there were no longer mythic figures. They were farmers, shopkeepers, immigrants who spoke with thick accents, teachers, adolescents, and fathers who didn't reside to see the harvest.
