The house owner chose to spend for hazmat dealing with to save time, accepted the firm rate, and set up for 9 a.m. 2 crew members showed up early, prepped doorframes with blankets, and had the garage clear by 10:45. They swept up sawdust, left the usable lumber aside for a next-door

neighbor who asked to keep it, and offered contribution receipts for the bikes after delivering them to a community repair work program. The billing matched the quote. That is the standard to seek.

The ecological math of one truck
