- **Jackpot:** Multiple players pool their skins into a single pot. The greater the value of a gamer's skin relative to the total pot, the higher their portion possibility of winning the entire swimming pool.
- **Case Opening:** Simulated versions of Valve's in-game case openings, frequently including personalized odds and higher-tier reward swimming pools created by the website operators.

Comparing Types of CS: GO Gambling Platforms
