What really drives the price

Every Garage Door job has the very same core pieces: the door itself, the equipment that lifts it, the opener that automates it, and the skilled labor to establish whatever square and secure. Those break down into a number of drivers.

Door dimension establishes the baseline. A conventional solitary door at 8 feet broad by 7 feet high generally costs much much less than a double at 16 by 7. Odd dimensions, like 9 by 8 or 18 by 8, push you off automation rails and elevate rate. A single steel door can start around 700 to 1,200 bucks for the slab just, while a dual frequently begins at 1,200 and climbs up past 3,500 before you add equipment or installation.

Material and building matter next. Non-insulated steel is the access point. - Opener: Belt drive with Wi-Fi and battery backup. 450 to 650 dollars.

Premium double, aesthetic charm and durability:
