

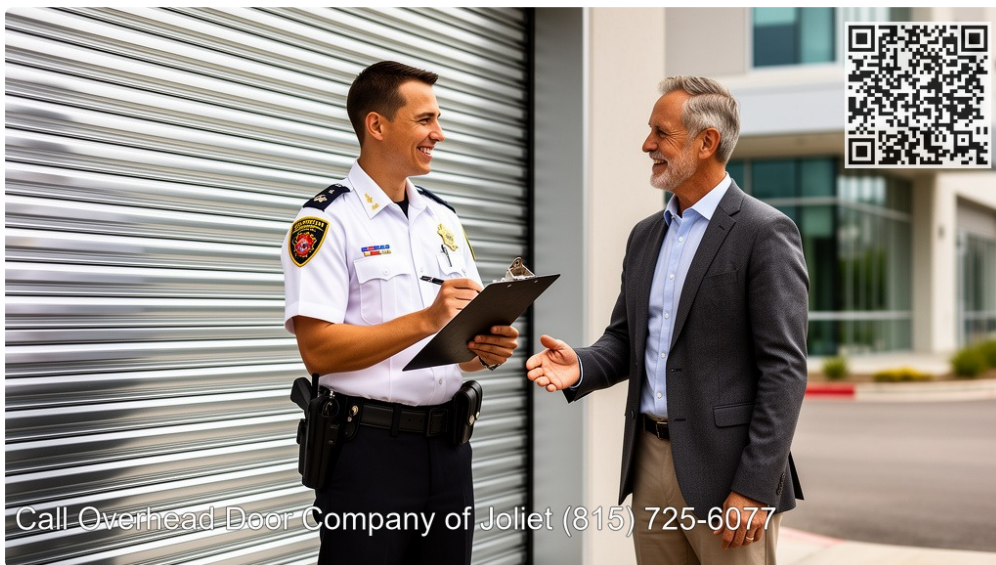

Three Chicago stories that clarify our approach

A circulation center near O'Hare switched out two aging fire-rated rolling doors that divided the dock from the finished-goods passage. The initial doors were hefty, manual-only devices that nobody wanted to examine. Evaluations turned into tense afternoons. We changed them with motorized, identified 3-hour doors with governors and electric launching devices tied into the center's FACP. Door size was 14 feet by 12 feet, with shielded slats and overview weatherstripping. We included neighborhood horn strobes at each side and an annunciated push-to-open after drop, collaborated with the fire defense designer. During commissioning, the plant supervisor enjoyed a full decrease examination from initiation to reset. The reset treatment took under 4 minutes. A year later on, their NFPA 80 annual examination log shows absolutely no failings, and their insurance carrier noted the enhancement in the loss-control report.

On a limited street in Wicker Park, a mixed-use building needed a silent, trustworthy garage door for lessee car park that would certainly not fight the winter months wind. A shielded sectional with a 25,000 cycle spring would have functioned, yet web traffic counts from the apartment board showed 200 to 300 cycles daily. We upgraded to a 75,000 cycle springtime set, placed a quiet jackshaft driver with a warmed control enclosure, and coordinated a draft stop information at the lintel to close a pesky 1-inch gap many people miss out on. The driver's soft-start smoothed out early morning actuations, and the energy loss via that opening went down significantly. The building designer called the very first polar vortex after turn over and claimed, just, the entrance hall is cozy for the very first time in years.

An automobile service center in the West Loop had a seven-foot opening from the bays right into a customer care workdesk, drawn as a rated wall. The incorrect product, a standard counter shutter without a tag, turned up

from a previous supplier. Their permit review flagged it, and the job stalled. We gauged, got an identified fire-rated counter door with a 90-minute tag, and set up a small releasing panel that tied nicely right into the existing tamper and waterflow circuits with the emergency alarm service provider. The room was tight, so we fabricated a clean angle frame to prevent drilling into the demising wall's studs, which the architect wanted untouched. We then trained staff to reset the door after a drill. The solution moved the job off redline and earned a clean final on the first re-inspection.

Maintenance that really protects people

A door is not compliant if it can not pass its very own examination a year from currently. A cold street door that sees salt spray and freeze-thaw needs a different touch than an interior counter shutter.

NFPA 80 calls for yearly evaluation and screening of fire doors, including a drop test and documented reset.
