The leathered perimeter masked smudges from little hands and looked sturdy below powerful daylight hours from a slider. The polished island became used on the whole for homework, baking, and enjoyable, and that they cherished the way it reflected pendant gentle right through dinner. Two finishes created zones with out clashing.

A severe domestic baker insisted on honed marble for a twelve-foot island. She accepts patina. We sealed it, proficient the kin about citrus, and established a small polished quartz slab on a nearby cart for coffee. The marble displays mushy marks after two years, quite in the kneading space, but it appears intentionally elderly other than broken, that is exactly what she desired.

A minimalist couple hooked up polished absolute black granite, best to call two weeks later about water spots across the sink. We swapped that part for a honed absolute black. The relaxation of the kitchen stayed polished.
