Usually, a quarter tank is enough for shipping, but it is always wise to follow the shipper's instructions. Different carriers may have slightly different recommendations.

Disable Alarms and Secure Loose Parts

If your vehicle has an alarm system, turn it off before pickup so it does not go off during transport. You should also secure or remove loose accessories such as toll tags, antennas, aftermarket racks, or removable spoilers if needed. Anything that can shake loose during shipping should be addressed ahead of time.

These precautions help protect both the vehicle and the equipment used to transport it. They also reduce the chance of interruptions during the trip.

Make the Car Easy to Access
