Float Values and Wear Conditions

No two skins are completely similar thanks to the **Float Value** system. A float value is a number in between **0.00** and **1.00** that figures out the physical wear and tear on a weapon's texture.

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine condition)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Minor scratches)
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Heavily damaged, sometimes revealing concealed patterns)

Note: Some skins are "float-capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float variations remarkably unusual and costly.

The Anatomy of Value: Why Do Skins Cost A Lot?

While some skins cost mere cents, others have cost numerous thousands of dollars. A combination of factors determines why a digital product commands such high rates:

1. **Supply and Demand:** If a weapon case is stopped (moved to the "uncommon drop swimming pool"), the supply of its contents diminishes while the gamer base grows, driving rates up.
2. **Float and Pattern Index:** Certain patterns (like Case Hardened "Blue Gems") or very low float worths produce unique products that collectors contest.
3. **Pro Player Association:** When an expert esports gamer pulls off a famous clutch using a particular weapon finish, that skin often sees an immediate spike in appeal and rate.
4. **Trade-Up Contracts:** Players can feed 10 skins of one rarity into a contract to get one skin of the next greater tier, completely erasing the inputs and reducing the general market supply.

Popular Weapon Families and Iconic Skins

Over a years of updates has actually produced thousands of skins. However, a few stand apart as cultural touchstones within the community.

Iconic Skins Worth Knowing:

- **AWP|Dragon Lore:** The holy grail of CS: GO trading. Initially dropping exclusively on Cobblestone maps, its golden dragon artwork makes it a treasured ownership for high-tier collectors.
- **AK-47|Case Hardened:** Famous for its different blue and gold pattern percentages. A 100% blue leading version can command astronomical amounts.
- **M4A4|Howl:** The only skin classified as "Contraband." It was eliminated from main drops due to copyright violation concerns surrounding its art work, making existing copies irreplaceable.
- **StatTrak™ Factory New Asiimov:** A sci-fi traditional featuring a clean white, black, and orange color combination that remains a fan preferred throughout several weapons.

- **Random Drops:** Simply using official or community servers grants weekly care plans containing weapon drops or graffiti.
