- **Visual Anchors:** Crash sites assist gamers quickly call out locations to colleagues (e.g., "He's planting behind the airplane wing!").

Designing a balanced map around a disorderly element like a crash website is no small accomplishment. A crash website is inherently chaotic, jagged, and asymmetrical. - **Lighting and Contrast:** Burning wreckage emits vibrant lighting and smoke particles, which can obscure player models (agents) using specific camouflage skins.
