Outside Wears and Float Values

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Very Little Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look almost similar in Field-Tested and Factory New, while others look greatly broken down even at low floats. Collectors often pay huge premiums for skins with very low (or in some cases ridiculously high) float values.



Active vs. Rare (Discontinued) Case Pools

Valve classifies cases into two main groups, which straight affects their supply and market cost.

1. The Active Drop Pool
