

If you reside in Scarborough, ON, recognizing when to call for pest control scarborough services can save you time and money. As part of the east end of Toronto, Scarborough includes detached homes, townhomes, condos, and apartment buildings, which means pest problems can present differently from one address to the next. **Live insects** are a direct sign that action is needed. ## Which pests are most frequently seen in Scarborough homes and condos?

**Cockroaches** are particularly concerning because they can spread fast and thrive in out-of-sight, heated, moist spaces. Cooking spaces, service closets, and shared laundry rooms are frequent harbourage sites. Cockroaches can also provoke allergies and pose contamination concerns, making immediate response important.

**Bed bugs** are a significant issue in apartment building and condominium properties because they move through furniture, luggage, and neighboring units. They are often found in bedrooms, upholstered furniture, and cracks near sleeping areas. Itchy bites, dark spotting on bedding, and live insects around mattress seams are common clues.

**Hornets** typically grow more aggressive around eaves, fascia areas, porches, and outside storage spots during warmer months. A visible nest or frequent wasp movement near entrances can become a safety concern, especially for families with children or people with allergies.

**House spiders** are frequently spotted in basements, garages, edges, and storage rooms. Although many spiders are harmless, a quick spike may indicate that additional bugs are present, since spiders go where prey is available.

## How do seasonal changes in Scarborough affect pest activity?

Scarborough's weather patterns can strongly influence pest pressure. Lake Ontario adds water-influenced humidity, and the region experiences pronounced seasonal temperature swings. That combination can drive pests indoors or promote breeding outdoors depending on the time of year.

**Winter infestations** are common because rodents and some insects seek a warmer environment, shelter, and food inside homes and condo buildings. Cold weather drives mice and rats toward protected basements, kitchens, and utility spaces. In older homes, small gaps around pipes or foundations can become open invitations.

**Spring pest activity** often rises as temperatures warm and pests become more active after winter. **Neighbouring units** matter as well. If several residents in the same hallway, floor, or row of townhomes report similar signs, that can point to a broader building-level issue.
