2. **Web Grounding:** The platform integrates live web search and citation tools to ground answers in current, verifiable information rather than training data fabrications.

This dual approach reduces hallucinations prominent in isolated LLM deployments significantly — a key improvement over tools that lack rigorous cross-validation or web integration.
