MOLE (Nevus)

DEFINITION
A benign growth of pigment-producing cells (melanocytes). Caused by genetics, sun exposure, or hormonal changes.

KEY FINDING
Looks smooth, has a uniform color, and can be flat or raised. They are not contagious and hair may grow from them.

RISK FACTOR
Carries a low but possible risk of transforming into melanoma skin cancer. Monitor for ABCDE changes (Asymmetry, Border, Color, Diameter, Evolving).

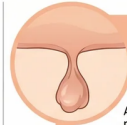


WART

DEFINITION
A viral skin infection caused by HPV (human papillomavirus). It is highly contagious through direct contact.

KEY FINDING
Has a rough, grainy, "cauliflower-like" surface. Often contains small black dots, which are clotted blood vessels.

RISK FACTOR
Can spread easily to other body parts and can multiply. Requires medical treatment like cryotherapy or laser to remove.



SKIN TAG (Acrochordon)

DEFINITION
A soft, benign overgrowth of normal skin tissue. Caused by friction and is common in skin folds.

KEY FINDING
Appears soft, floppy, and hangs from the skin by a thin stalk. It is not contagious and is usually the same color as the skin.

RISK FACTOR
Has zero cancer risk and is not contagious. Removal is typically for cosmetic reasons or if it becomes irritated.
