Valve's Stance and Regulatory Crackdowns

- **The 2016 Cease-and-Desist Era:** Valve sent official notices to dozens of prominent skin gambling sites, demanding they closed down operations as they breached the Steam Subscriber Agreement.
- **Trade Hold Updates:** To suppress instant trading and cash laundering, Valve presented a compulsory 7-day trade hang on any traded skin. While this briefly disrupted the gambling market, operators rapidly adjusted using P2P systems and crypto cash-outs.
- **Legal Scrutiny:** Governments worldwide have actually begun taking notification. Class-action suits, government investigations, and statutory restrictions in various nations have actually required operators to continuously move domains and legal structures.
