

A dependable garage door protects your vehicle, belongings, and home while offering everyday convenience. In Los Angeles, high temperatures, strong sunlight, coastal humidity, worn hardware, and regular operation can gradually wear down an overhead garage door. If the garage door will not close, inspect the photo-eye sensors near the bottom of the tracks. These garage door safety sensors must point toward one another and remain free of dust, cobwebs, and obstructions. Misalignment, damaged wiring, or direct sunlight can interrupt the signal. Do not bypass the sensors; they are designed to stop the door if a person, pet, or object crosses the opening.

A failed **counterbalance spring** can prevent proper movement even if the motor runs. The motor may hum while the door stays in place, or the opener may strain and shut off. Springs are under considerable tension, so homeowners should not attempt to wind them. Disconnecting the opener and manually lifting a heavy door can also create a major risk of injury.

Squeaky, Drooping, or Off-Track Garage Doors

Scraping, screeching, snapping, or rattling may point to weakened garage door rollers, poorly secured fasteners, stiff hinges, misaligned tracks, or insufficient lubrication.
