

Moving to a new home is an important transition that requires careful planning, organization, and physical effort. Why Planning Is Important for a Local Move

A local relocation may involve a shorter driving distance than a long-distance move, but that does not mean it requires less preparation. You still need to coordinate packing, transportation, property access, furniture handling, utilities, and your personal schedule.

Without a plan, small problems can quickly become major inconveniences. Boxes may not be labeled correctly, important items may be packed too early, or movers may encounter unexpected stairs, narrow hallways, parking restrictions, or building requirements.

Planning in advance gives you time to identify potential challenges and communicate important details to your moving team. It can also make it easier to compare moving services and establish a realistic budget.

Start Planning Your Everett Move Early

One of the simplest ways to reduce moving stress is to begin preparations well before moving day. Starting early gives you enough time to organize belongings, research moving companies, gather packing supplies, and address unexpected issues.

Create a moving timeline based on your relocation date. You can divide the process into smaller tasks and assign deadlines to each one. This approach prevents the entire move from becoming a last-minute project.

Six to Eight Weeks Before Moving

This is also a good time to begin sorting your belongings. Decide which possessions you want to keep, donate, sell, recycle, or discard.

Four to Six Weeks Before Moving

Confirm your moving arrangements and begin notifying organizations and service providers about your upcoming address change.

One to Two Weeks Before Moving

Complete most of your packing and keep only essential daily-use items accessible. Confirm the moving schedule, property access, parking arrangements, and any elevator reservations if applicable.

The Day Before Moving

Finish last-minute packing, charge electronic devices, prepare an essentials bag, and make sure important documents and valuables are separated from the items being transported by the moving crew.

Request Written Moving Estimates

Pay particular attention to:

- Pickup and delivery addresses
- Scheduled moving date
- Services included
- Estimated or agreed charges
- Payment requirements
- Cancellation policies
- Additional service fees
- Liability and valuation coverage
- Procedures for reporting damage

If you do not understand a clause, ask the company to explain it before agreeing to the contract.

Create a Moving Inventory

An inventory is useful for both organization and accountability. You do not necessarily need an elaborate spreadsheet. A basic list of boxes and major belongings can make it easier to track your possessions.

Consider recording valuable or fragile items separately. You can also photograph the condition of important furniture and electronics before they are loaded.

Label each box with its destination room and a short description of its contents. For example, labels such as “Kitchen – Plates” or “Bedroom – Bedding” can make unloading much more organized.

Declutter Before Packing

Moving is an excellent opportunity to reduce unnecessary possessions. Transporting items you no longer want can increase the amount of packing, loading, and unloading required.

Go through each room and separate belongings into categories:

- Keep
- Donate
- Sell
- Recycle
- Dispose

Start with storage areas, closets, garages, and rarely used rooms. Once unnecessary items are removed, packing and unpacking become easier.

Pack With a System

Randomly filling boxes can create confusion when you reach your new home. Instead, establish a consistent packing system.

Pack similar items together whenever practical and avoid making boxes excessively heavy. Books, canned goods, and other dense objects should be placed in smaller boxes to make them easier to carry.

Use appropriate cushioning for fragile belongings. Plates, glasses, electronics, artwork, and other delicate possessions may require additional protection.

Label Every Box

Clearly label boxes on multiple sides. Include the room where the box belongs and whether the contents are fragile or require special handling.

Color-coded labels or simple numbering systems can also help you quickly identify boxes during unloading.

Prepare an Essentials Bag

Do not pack everything into the moving truck. Prepare a personal essentials bag that you can access immediately after arriving at your new home.

It may include:

- Change of clothes

- Toiletries
- Phone chargers
- Important documents
- Basic medications
- Snacks and water
- Basic cleaning supplies
- Important keys
- Essential electronics

Having these items readily available means you do not need to search through dozens of boxes immediately after arriving.

Plan Property Access in Advance

Access can have a major effect on moving efficiency. Before moving day, determine where the moving truck can park and how movers will get belongings from the property to the vehicle.

For apartments and multi-unit buildings, check whether there are designated loading areas or restricted moving hours. You may need to reserve an elevator or coordinate with building management.

For houses, consider driveway access, gate widths, stairs, narrow walkways, and other potential obstacles. Inform your movers about unusual access conditions before they arrive.

Moving From an Apartment

Tell your movers about these items before moving day. Ask whether they provide specialized packing or transportation services and whether certain belongings require special preparation.

Some items may have transportation restrictions or may not be accepted by certain companies, so confirm requirements in advance.

Keep Valuables and Important Documents With You

Important documents, personal valuables, financial records, keys, and irreplaceable items should be kept secure. Consider transporting these belongings yourself rather than placing them inside the moving truck.

This can make it easier to keep track of items that are especially important to you during the transition.
