- **The Martingale System:** A classic wagering technique where a player doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recuperate all previous losses plus an earnings equivalent to the initial base bet. Nevertheless, this needs an enormous bankroll and can rapidly hit website betting limits.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses reduced to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intention of holding out for enormous multipliers (50x, 100x, or higher). This works similar to playing the lotto.

Pros and Cons of CS: GO Crash
