| <b>Very Little Wear (MW)</b> | 0.07-- 0.15       | Minor acnes, small scratches, or extremely faint wear on edges.                        |
| <b>Field-Tested (FT)</b>     | 0.15-- 0.38       | Obvious scratches and use, though the core artwork remains mostly undamaged.           |
| <b>Well-Worn (WW)</b>        | 0.38-- 0.45       | Substantial wear, distinct paint chipping, and duller colors.                          |
| <b>Battle-Scarred (BS)</b>   | 0.45-- 1.00       | Heavy damage, seriously broke paint, and sometimes, a nearly indistinguishable design. |

Loadouts are frequently classified by color or style to create a cohesive aesthetic in-game. Typical themes favored by the [case opening](#) community consist of:



- **Red & Black:** High-contrast, aggressive loadouts using products like the AK-47|Redline and M4A4|Asiimov.
- **Blue Themes:** Serene and icy appearances featuring the M4A1-S|Blue Phosphor or USP-S|Cortex.
- **Covert Minimalist:** Clean, understated styles that do not sidetrack throughout intense competitive rounds.

## The Virtual Economy and Marketplace
