Coinflip	A straightforward 1v1 PvP video game where two gamers wager skins of roughly equivalent worth. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the entire pot. 50/50 odds, minus a little platform commission (rake).	
Jackpot	Multiple players contribute skins to a main pot. Each skin's value determines the player's "ticket" share. A spinner picks one winner who takes everything. Based on the total worth contributed; platform takes a percentage cost.
