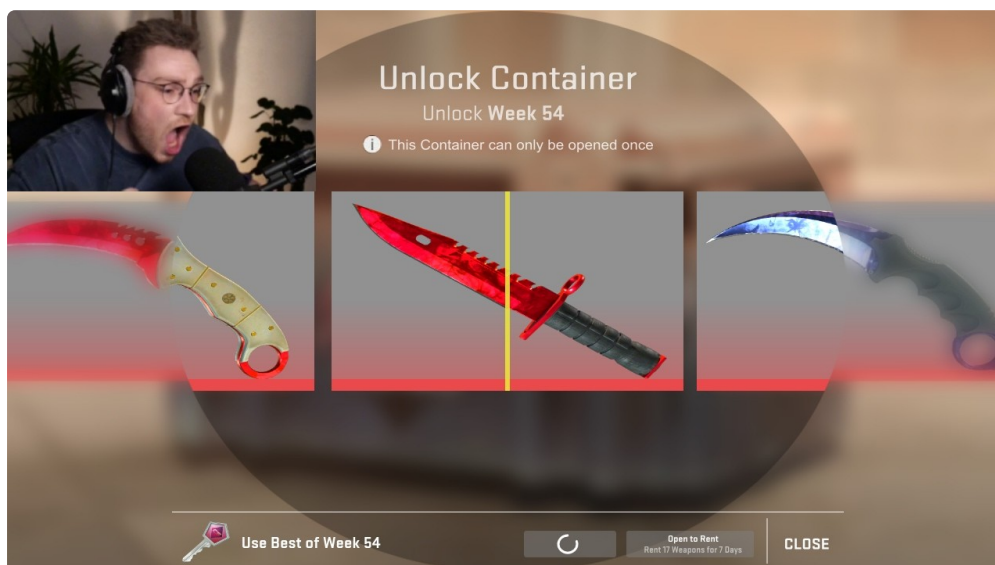

Each new operation or seasonal event typically brings a fresh case, expanding the pool of available skins and influencing market rates.



## 3. How Cases Are Obtained

Gamers can get cases in 3 primary ways:

1. **Random Drop**-- After finishing a match, players have a small chance ( $\approx 1\%$ ) to receive a weapon case as a random drop.
2. **Buy from the In-Game Shop**-- Cases are constantly readily available for purchase at a repaired rate (normally £ 0.50-- £ 2.50 GBP, depending upon the case).
3. **Market Trading**-- Secondary-market platforms (Steam Community Market, third-party sites) permit traders to purchase and sell cases at market-driven prices.

## 4. Opening Cases and Drop Rates

The expense of opening a case includes the rate of the case itself plus the key (generally £ 2.50 GBP). Players must weigh the expected worth of the skin they may receive against the total expense.
