

CS: GO Weapon Cases: A Comprehensive Guide

- 1. **Know the Rarity Hierarchy**-- Understanding the 5 skin grades (Consumer, Industrial, Mil-Spec, Restricted, Classified, Covert, and Extraordinary) assists set expectations.

2. **Look For Supply Shocks**-- When a case is ceased or eliminated from the drop swimming pool, its scarcity frequently drives prices up.
3. **Diversify Your Portfolio**-- Holding a mix of older, steady cases (e.g., the initial CS: GO Weapon Case) and newer, high-variance cases balances danger.
