The main objective is easy: players place bets on which section the wheel will stop on. However, the inclusion of a Top Slot multiplier in every single round-- alongside four wildly different bonus offer video games-- raises it far beyond a conventional wheel-of-fortune video game.

Understanding the Wheel Segments

The 52-segment wheel is divided into numbers and reward video games. The numbers pay even money or better, while the benefit symbols offer players entry into the video game's heading acts.

Here is how the wheel is distributed:

- **Number 1:** 21 sectors (Pays 1:1)
- **Number 2:** 13 segments (Pays 2:1)
- **Number 5:** 7 sectors (Pays 5:1)
- **Number 10:** 4 sectors (Pays 10:1)
- **Coin Flip:** 4 segments
- **Pachinko:** 2 sections
- **Cash Hunt:** 2 sectors
- **Crazy Time:** 1 sector

The Top Slot Feature

Before every spin of the primary wheel, a two-reel mini slot maker situated straight above the wheel spins all at once.

- **Reel 1** screens a bet area (either a number or a benefit video game).
- **Reel 2** display screens a multiplier (varying from 2x as much as 50x).

If the bet spot and the multiplier align horizontally, that multiplier is applied to the matching sector on the main wheel for that round. If the wheel arrive on that section, all wins for that bet are multiplied appropriately, setting the phase for enormous payouts.

Dive Into the Four Bonus Rounds

The true magic-- and volatility-- of Crazy Time lies in its four interactive reward rounds. These games transport gamers out of the studio by means of CGI and offer the video game's most significant win potential.

1. Coin Flip

The easiest of the perk rounds, Coin Flip features a red-and-blue token flipped by a machine.

- **How it works:** Before the flip, both sides of the coin are assigned random multipliers.
- **The Outcome:** Whichever color lands face up awards the player the multiplier attached to that side.

2. Pachinko

Motivated by the conventional Japanese arcade video game, Pachinko features a large physical wall filled with pegs.

- **How it works:** The host drops a puck from the top of the board. It bounces randomly down through the pegs till it lands in one of numerous multiplier slots at the bottom.
- **The "Double" Feature:** If the puck lands in a "DOUBLE" slot, all multipliers at the bottom of the board double, and the puck is dropped once again for an opportunity at even larger prizes.

3. Cash Hunt

Money Hunt is an interactive shooting gallery video game provided on a massive screen with 108 random multipliers hidden behind different signs (like a cactus, a target, or a chef's hat).

- **How it works:** Players use an on-screen cannon to aim and shoot at a sign of their choice before the countdown timer expires. As soon as the timer ends, all players reveal the multiplier hidden behind their picked target. (Note: In automated play, the game chooses a target for the gamer).

4. Crazy Time

The supreme perk round and the hardest to activate. The host opens a red door, leading players into a surreal, brightly colored virtual world featuring an enormous, 64-segment wheel.

- **How it works:** Players must select one of three flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The host spins the wheel, and whichever multiplier the selected flapper indicate when the wheel stops is awarded to the player.
- **The "Double" and "Triple" sections:** Just like Pachinko, if the wheel stops on a "DOUBLE" or "TRIPLE" section, all multipliers on the wheel boost accordingly, and the wheel is spun again. This is where the

maximum 20,000 x multiplier can be achieved.

Pros and Cons of Playing Crazy Time

Like all gambling establishment games, Crazy Time includes its own distinct set of benefits and potential downsides.

Pros:

- **Unmatched Entertainment Value:** High-energy hosts, bright visuals, and game-show styling make it exceptionally fun to see and play.
- **Massive Win Potential:** With the assistance of the Top Slot and bonus round multipliers, wins can reach up to 20,000 x the stake.
- **Interactive Elements:** Games like Cash Hunt and Crazy Time require (or simulate) player involvement, including a layer of engagement not discovered in standard slots.

Cons:

- **High Volatility:** Because a big portion of the wheel's payout potential is tied to bonus rounds, droughts can rapidly drain pipes a bankroll.
- **Lower RTP on Bonuses:** While standard number bets have a fairly good Return to Player, wagering exclusively on perk rounds normally carries a lower theoretical RTP.
- **Busy:** Rounds take place quickly, which can cause spending too much if players do not manage their bankrolls thoroughly.

Basic Strategies for Crazy Time

While Crazy Time is a video game of pure possibility determined by a random number generator (RNG) and physical wheel physics, gamers typically use betting strategies to manage threat and extend their playtime.

- **The Cover-All Strategy:** Betting on all or the majority of the segments (numbers and benefit video games) ensures you rarely miss out on a spin, though the expense of covering the board can outweigh the smaller sized payments.
- **Bonus offer Chasing:** Focusing specifically on the benefit rounds (Coin Flip, Pachinko, Cash Hunt, and Crazy Time). This is a high-risk, high-reward method since bonus offer rounds occur on just 9 of the 52 segments.
- **Analytical Betting:** Relying on the video game's history tracker. Some gamers like to bank on sectors that have not struck in a very long time (the "hot/cold" fallacy), though past spins statistically have no bearing on future outcomes.
