

The first time I assisted a next-door neighbor install a lawn sprinkler system, we set aside one weekend. We finished on the 3rd, aching, sunburned, and a little humbled. The system functioned, although we invested the next month dialing in head positioning, taking care of tiny leaks, and learning why water pressure theoretically does not always match what appears of a trench line after 8 tees and a surge in quality.
