

An sectional garage door should lift and lower without jerking, with both sides moving at nearly the same speed. If the door opens crooked, shakes, stalls, or appears to lean, the problem may involve the springs, lift cables, garage door rollers, tracks, hinges, or the opener. Uneven movement is more than an inconvenience: it can place excessive stress on the door and create a significant safety hazard.

Before attempting garage door repair, find out whether the problem is a minor alignment issue or a failure involving a loaded spring or cable. Homeowners can perform a few visual and operational checks, but repairs involving springs, cable drums, and lift cables should generally be handled by a qualified local technician.

What Irregular Garage Door Movement Looks Like

Uneven movement can present itself in several ways. One side of the overhead garage door may begin rising before the other, causing the door to lift unevenly. The door may jam in one section, halt halfway, scrape against the garage door tracks, or make a noticeable popping and grinding sound. A noisy garage door may also vibrate as it travels or require repeated opener cycles to close completely.

Watch the door while it moves from a secure position several feet away. Look for a gap that changes between the door and the tracks, rollers that jump out of their guides, or door sections that are no longer aligned. A damaged garage door panel can warp the entire assembly and make the door appear uneven even when the opener is working normally.

The garage door opener may also be wrongly held responsible. An opener provides movement through the drive system, but it does not normally resolve a door that is out of balance. If the door moves unevenly when operated manually, the issue is likely mechanical rather than electrical. Continuing to use the opener can increase damage to the tracks, rollers, and motor.

Frequent Causes of an Uneven Garage Door

The most common causes include a worn garage door spring, loose or frayed lift cables, damaged garage door rollers, misaligned garage door tracks, worn hinges, and damaged sections. A door can also become uneven when hardware shifts over time or when the track alignment changes after an impact.

A torsion spring is mounted above the door and operates alongside a shaft and cable drum. Extension spring systems are usually positioned along the horizontal tracks and stretch as the door operates. Both systems store significant energy. Attempting to adjust, remove, or replace either type without the correct tools and training can cause severe injury.

A Compromised Panel or Misaligned Door Sections

A garage door panel may be bent by a vehicle, sports equipment, wind, or an impact near the bottom of the door. Damage to one panel can prevent the door sections from articulating correctly as they travel around the tracks. Cracks, separated joints, crushed edges, and visible warping are signs that the panel may be causing the problem.

Door sections must remain securely joined and supported. If one section is sagging, the hinges may be damaged or the fasteners may have come loose from the material. In some cases, panel replacement fixes the operation issue. The correct solution depends on the door’s age, design, insulation, color, and availability of matching replacement parts.

When several sections are damaged, the door is badly corroded, or the design is discontinued, full garage door replacement may be more practical. Compare the repair estimate with the expected garage door replacement cost, including taking out the old door, disposal, new hardware, and installation.

Secure Inspections Property owners Can Perform

Begin with a visual inspection while the door is closed. Look for gaps in the spring, loose or frayed cables, bent tracks, missing rollers, damaged hinges, broken panels, and objects blocking the travel path. Do not place your hands between door sections or underneath the door.

A manual lift test can help identify a balance issue, but only perform it if the door is closed and there is no visible broken spring or frayed cable. Pull the emergency release cord to disconnect the garage door opener, then carefully lift the door by its handles. A properly balanced door should move steadily and remain near the halfway position with limited effort. If it drops, rises rapidly, feels extremely heavy, or moves crookedly, stop the test and arrange professional service.

After testing, close the door fully before reconnecting the opener. Keep children and pets away from the opening. Check the photo-eye sensors near the floor on both sides of the door. They should face each other, remain mounted at the same height, and have clean lenses. Misaligned photo-eye sensors usually cause a door to reverse rather than move unevenly, but they are an important part of garage door safety.

Do not pull the emergency release cord while the door is open unless a professional has confirmed that it is safe. A door with a broken spring or failed cable may fall when disconnected from the garage door opener.

When to Stop Using the Door and Call a Professional

Discontinue using the door immediately if you see a broken garage door spring, a frayed lift cable, a cable that has come off the cable drum, a door that is hanging at an angle, or a track that has pulled away from the wall. Also stop if the door slams down, will not stay open, makes loud popping sounds, or becomes suddenly much heavier.

A garage door repair technician can stabilize the door, identify the failed component, and complete a safety inspection. Spring systems and cables are under high tension, and improvised repairs can damage the opener or cause the door to collapse. Avoid forcing the door with a vehicle, using ropes as a substitute for cables, or removing spring brackets.

For garage door safety, leave the door closed until service arrives when possible. Tell the technician exactly what happened, whether the door was struck, and whether the uneven movement began gradually or suddenly. These details can help separate a worn component from an alignment or structural issue.
