No more Howls will ever be dropped or unboxed, making every existing system a set possession in the economy.

What Drives Skin Rarity?

Rarity isn't just about the color of the text in a player's inventory. Three primary mechanics determine how rare-- and valuable-- a specific weapon surface truly is.

- **Float Values (Wear Rating):** CS2 skins vary from *Factory New* (0.00 to 0.07) to *Battle-Scarred* (0.45 to 1.00). Some skins are "float topped," meaning they can not drop in Factory New condition, making the most affordable possible float for that skin exceptionally uncommon.
