- **Foggy Double-Paned Glass:** Indicates that the seal in between the 2 panes has actually failed, enabling wetness and condensation to get trapped inside.

Getting Rid Of the Door Panel(If Applicable)For many sliding patio area doors or inset door panels, it is much easier to work on the glass if the door is removed from its frame and laid flat on a workbench or saw-horses. - **Measure the height, width, and thickness of the glass opening. Use a fresh bead of silicone sealant or brand-new**
