How key replacement changes once electronics are involved

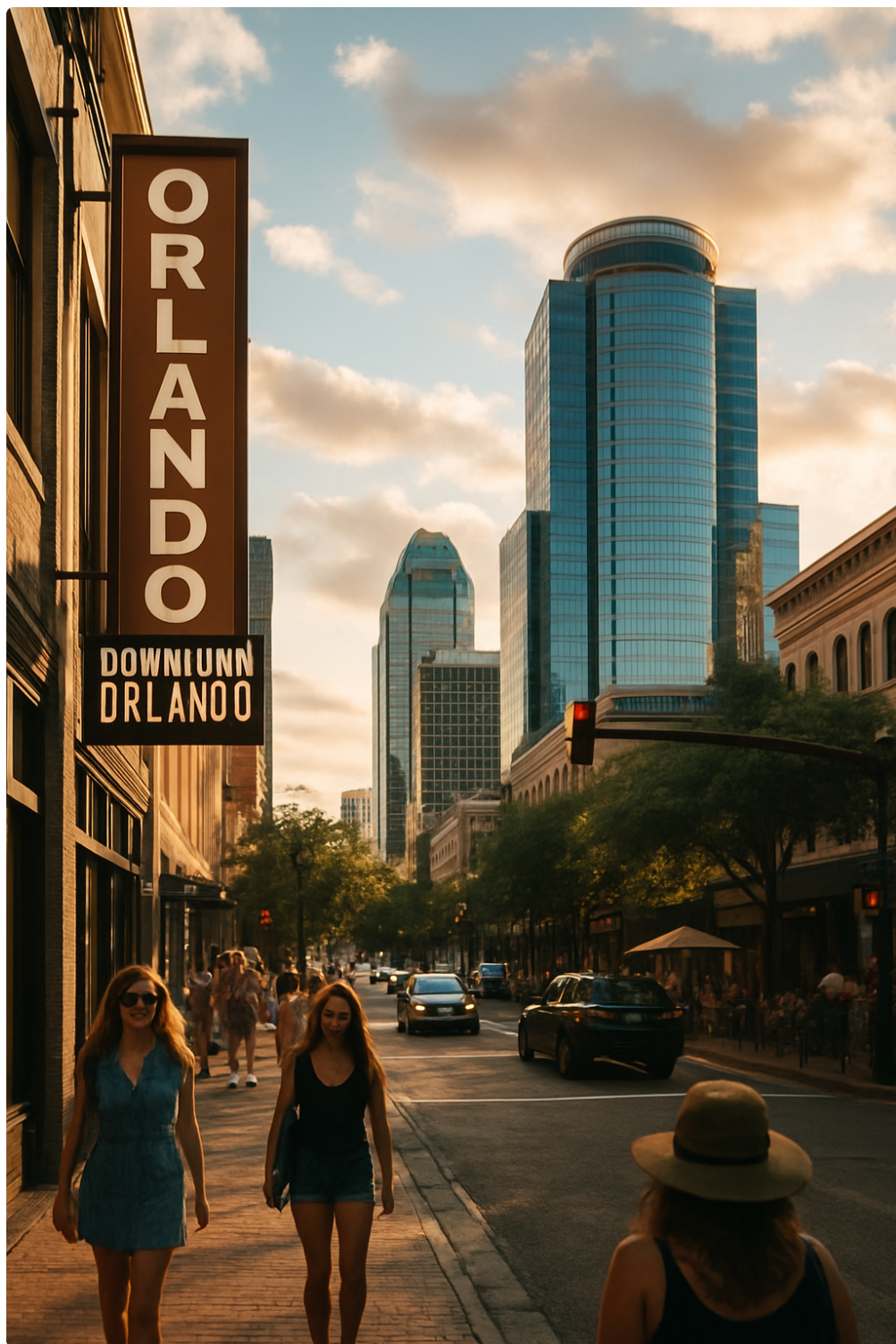
